Tour of Hackenberg Prize-Winning Project Over-the-Rhine, Cincinnati at Miami University

Join members of the 2023 Hackenberg Prize winning Miami University Center for Community Engagement to view their work in Over the Rhine Cincinnati. Participants will meet with the directors of the prominent community-based affordable housing provider, the leaders of a vibrant community arts center that is also a locus for multiple social justice and labor organizations, or tour one of our many student/community architectural design-build sites in Over-the-Rhine. These excursions will show how collaborative community engagement has benefitted both Miami University and the community of Over-the-Rhine. The Urban Cohort alumni will be available to describe how these Hackenberg Prize-winning programs informed their academic and career paths.

After the excursions, participants will regroup for a conversation, there will be light refreshments for those who would like to stay and talk about the programs in greater detail.
